Utility Scams Tip of the Month

Scammers will go to great lengths to trick utility customers, including claiming that you've overpaid your bill. If you get a call, text, or email saying you've overpaid and need to provide your banking or credit card details to receive a credit, it's probably a scam. Typically, your utility company will apply any credit to your account for future charges or issue a refund via check. Stay alert!

YOUTH TOUR 2025

In 1957, Senator Lyndon B. Johnson inspired the Youth Tour with a speech to the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA), envisioning a program where young people would travel to Washington, D.C. to experience the true meaning of the flag. The first Youth Tour was held in 1958, with 34 students from Iowa. The program grew quickly, with more states participating each year, and by 1959, 130 students joined. In 1964, NRECA coordinated the tour, which included over 400 participants from 12 states.

Today, more than 1,600 students and 250 chaperones take part in the Youth Tour annually. Texas students have the opportunity to visit iconic landmarks such as the Smithsonian, Lincoln Memorial, Mount Vernon, the U.S. Capitol, and the White House. They also meet senators, representatives, and sometimes even the president.

Chocolate Truffles

Ingredients:

- Two 4-ounce quality chocolate bars, very finely chopped
- 2/3 cup heavy cream
- Optional: 1 Tablespoon unsalted butter, softened to room temperature
- Optional: 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- Toppings: unsweetened cocoa powder, sprinkles, crushed nuts, melted or tempered chocolate



Instructions:

- Place chocolate in a heat-proof bowl.
- Heat cream until simmering, then pour over chocolate.
- Add butter (if using) and let sit for 5 minutes.
- Stir in vanilla until smooth
- Cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 1-2 hours (use a shallow dish for quicker setting).
- Scoop mixture into 2-teaspoon mounds (1 tbsp for larger truffles) and roll into balls.
- · Coat with toppings if desired
- Store truffles at room temperature for 3-4 days or in the fridge for up to 2 weeks.
